The Mass Incarceration Working Group is celebrating our fifth anniversary as a group.

We're celebrating how far legislative reforms have come in Massachusetts.

We're hearing briefly from Rahsaan Hall, the ACLU-MA's Racial Justice Director, about What a Difference a DA Makes.

A conference committee is currently discussing the House and Senate versions of the omnibus criminal justice bill, trying to come up with a consensus version that can get through the House and the Senate and become law. Perhaps that process will be done by mid-February, but probably not. The final bill will be far from perfect. And no legislative reforms — even perfect ones — could change everything that needs to be changed. A lot of policies and practices, philosophies and training programs, need to change too. People working in the system — from police officers to prosecutors to parole officers — need to shift how they understand their roles and have the resources to work differently.

We have a lot of work still to do.

But sometimes we need to celebrate. We need to come together, enjoy each other's company, lift up the good changes that have happened, and replenish our hope for more good changes in the future.

We will have table space for organizations to share information. If you'd like some table space, please indicate that on the RSVP form.

We know that some people enjoy baking but don't want to eat everything they bake. If you would enjoy bringing finger-food treats, please indicate that on the RSVP form too.

Most of all, we hope you'll join us!
