

LWVMA will host a webinar about ranked choice voting (RCV) on Tuesday, February 26, at 7 p.m. Adam Friedman of Voter Choice Massachusetts (<u>https://www.voterchoicema.org/</u>) will discuss the legislation being introduced to bring RCV to our state, then answer questions. Voter Choice Massachusetts is a non-profit, non-partisan advocacy organization formed to champion RCV in Massachusetts after Maine passed the first statewide RCV law in November 2016.

Bill McKibben to Keynote LWVMA Convention

Noted environmentalist Bill McKibben will be the keynote speaker at the state League's convention Friday and Saturday, June 7-8. McKibben will speak at Friday night's banquet. Watch for more convention details in the coming months.

McKibben is an author, environmentalist, and activist. He is a co-founder and senior advisor at 350.org (<u>https://350.org/</u>), an international climate campaign that works in 188 countries around the world. He is the Schumann Distinguished Scholar in Environmental Studies at Middlebury College and a former staff writer for *The New Yorker* who continues to write numerous magazine articles.

Commemorating the Boston Protest of 1919

The Women's Suffrage Celebration Coalition of Massachusetts (<u>http://suffrage100ma.org/</u>) will commemorate the centennial of the last arrests in Boston during the 72-year suffrage movement Thursday, Feb. 28, at noon at the State House in Boston. LWVMA and several local Leagues are part of this coalition.

Nearly 100 years ago, on Feb. 24, 1919, 25 women were arrested for protesting President Woodrow Wilson during his visit to the Massachusetts State House and at a parade in his honor. Most were imprisoned in Boston's Charles Street Jail. The protest was to lobby Wilson to pressure the U.S. Senate to pass the 19th Amendment.

MLK Celebrants Brave the Cold

The 31st annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Birthday Observance just happened to take place on the coldest day of the winter so far, January 21. Turnout was a bit sparser than usual, with snow on the ground and near-zero temperatures, but the audience made up in enthusiasm for what it lacked in numbers.

Host Pearl Morrison presented the annual local achievement award to Barbara Boltz, who has honored Dr. King's legacy as a longtime activist for peace and justice, from Boston's Rainbow Coalition in the 1980s to anti-nuclear activism to co-founding Arlington United for Justice with Peace.

Spirited music was provided for the second year in a row by the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Chorale, led by Paul White. (I for one hope this becomes an annual tradition.) The singer Lori Dow also performed, and the audience joined in a set of spirituals.

Bishop Brian Greene, pastor of the Pentecostal Tabernacle Church in Cambridge, introduced the speaker, Dr. Oneeka Williams, surgeon and children's book author, who inspired us all with an imagined conversation with Dr. King about his dreams.

The League of Women Voters of Arlington is a co-sponsor of the Observance.

Watermill Place is a condo building located next to the Old Schwamb Mill on Lowell Street in Arlington Heights.


From Arlington Center:

Follow Mass. Ave into the Heights. At the former Nicola Pizza, bear right onto Lowell Street and pass a few houses. Watermill Place will be on your right. Continue to the end of the building to the large Watermill Place sign. Turn right into the parking lot and drive past the green awning. There will be marked visitor spaces in front of you. If none are available you can park on Lowell Street, on the side where the building is.

From Park Avenue:

Follow Park Avenue down the hill to Mass. Ave. Continue straight and cross over Mass. Ave. (the optometrist and the UPS Store on two of the corners). Go over a bridge (Gold's Gym on the right). Take the first (sharp) right onto Lowell Street (Peter Pan Superette on the corner). Go over another bridge. There are about six houses very close together on the left. Watermill Place is on the left after the houses. Take a left into the driveway and drive past the green awning (entrance) to marked visitor spaces. If no spaces are available, you can park on Lowell Street, on the side where the building is.

Enter the building at the green awning. The name list is alphabetical by last name. Press A to get to the middle of the alphabet, then press Z repeatedly to arrow down to my last name, Olszewski. When my last name is highlighted, press the CALL button.


