In Memoriam: Judith Borit



Public Forum on 2012 Town Budget March 3

The Arlington Board of Selectmen will be holding a public forum at which Town Manager Brian Sullivan will present an overview of the Towns finances, the FY2012 Town budget, and its relative impacts on Town services. A question and answer session will follow. The public is invited to attend this forum to be held at Town Hall Auditorium, Thursday, March 3, at 7 p.m.

The Town Managercs FY2012 Financial Plan is now online at arlingtonma.gov/budgets.

The Arlington League's position on local sources of revenue sources is stated on our website as follows:

SOURCES OF REVENUE

The League of Women Voters of Arlington supports:

- 1. A tax system that is equitable, flexible, progressive and adequate to pay for services; subject to periodic review and examination and efficient to administer. The tax system should reflect community goals and be responsive to economic conditions. (1991)
- 2. Increased opportunities for citizen participation in all phases of the budget process; provisions for adequate citizen education as to the sources of revenue, county expenditures and fiscal alternatives. (1975 and 1991)
- 3. Equitable real estate assessments, levying service charges on tax-exempt property, and exploring alternative revenue sources. (1991)

ACTION ALERT: Presidential Public Financing in Danger

The presidential public financing system has served America well since 1976 by allowing candidates to raise the funds needed to wage competitive campaigns. Recently, the House of Representatives voted to eliminate the system which has substantially reduced corruption and the appearance of corruption in the executive branch since its inception.

Take action now to tell your Senators to oppose the elimination of the presidential public financing.

Repair legislation is expected soon that takes into account the changes that have occurred in presidential campaigns in recent years. It is this legislation that Congress should be focusing on.

April Lunch to Focus on Arlington Trees

At noon on April 1, the Friday Lunch Series at the studio of Arlington Community Media, Inc. (ACMI) will feature Sally Naish, chair of the Arlington Tree Committee. The event is open to the public and is sponsored by the League of Women Voters of Arlington.


- Children are no longer denied coverage for pre-existing conditions.
