Please contact Angela Olszewski at <u>amolszewski@gmail.com</u> if you are interested in volunteering for the event. We are especially in need of timers.

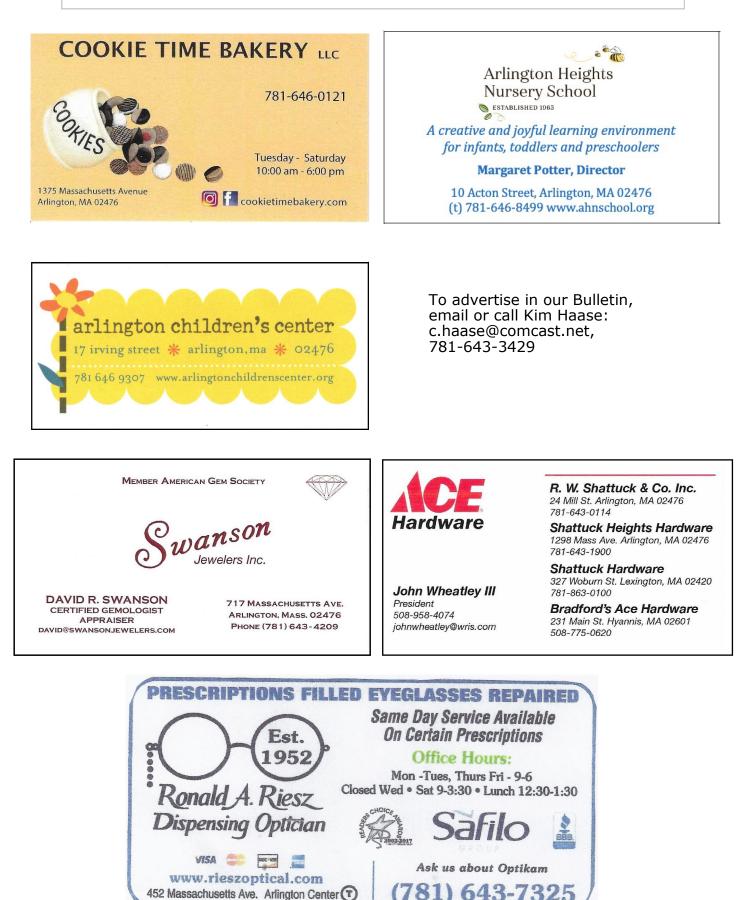
Questions for the candidates are being solicited from the public in advance. You can submit questions for consideration using this link: <u>https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/QDKKNJ5</u>. You can submit multiple questions for each office, but once you have submitted your questions you won't be able to submit any more on the same device, so plan your questions in advance.

The deadline for submitting questions is Wednesday, March 8th. Questions will be selected in advance by volunteers from the LWVA and Envision Arlington, and will be embedded in the moderator's script. There will be no way to ask questions at the event.

The town election will be held in person on Saturday, April 1st. Please see the town website or contact the Town Clerk's Office for information on vote by mail and early voting options.

We need volunteers for the following positions:

- **Timers**: We need at least four volunteers to keep time during the question-and-answer session, and to hold up time cards to keep all candidates within time limits so everyone gets a fair chance to speak.
- **Greeters**: We need at least two volunteers to greet people arriving at Candidates' Night and provide information about the League.
- Set-up/Take-down: Help us to put up precinct signs and get other items organized for the event or take down and pack up when the event is over.

Whether you're a student, educator, parent, administrator, policymaker, or a member of the general public, we have events for you. All events are free and virtual. You can take part in youth-led panel discussions, Q&A sessions with civic leaders, book readings, democratic simulations, curriculum and pedagogy workshops, and more.

Organized by the Massachusetts Civic Learning Coalition (MCLC) in conjunction with National Civic Learning Week, the virtual workshops and events are free and open to the public throughout the week of March 6-10, 2023. Karen Price and Cathy Dowd of the Needham League will speak on Monday, March 6 at 3:45 p.m., on "Teaching Civics through Advocacy for Bills Before the Massachusetts Legislature." This session will present materials and strategies for high school teachers to use to enable students to select an issue, research bills before the legislature, and develop and execute an advocacy plan. These materials include a Student Advocacy Guide and a set of short videos. The speakers will also present a structure for a civics showcase where students can make their pitch to state legislators, town officials, and the general public. They will also discuss the successful school / community collaboration with the League of Women Voters for this project.

The MCLC is organizing Civic Learning Week because civic education is needed more than ever to provide each and every person across this country with the necessary tools to engage as members of our self-governing society. The week's events will highlight the importance of civic education in sustaining and strengthening constitutional democracy in the United States through the voices of youths, teachers, administrators and policymakers. Civic Learning Week builds on the success of efforts that provided civic learning opportunities through programming that prompted participation by 20,000 students, teachers, and others in 2022.
