Directions to Meredith's House:

From the west end of Arlington, turn onto Overlook Rd. at the Summer St. traffic light across from the skating rink. Keep to the left at the fork and travel about 1/2 mile to Ridge St. Turn right onto Ridge St., then 1st left onto Cherokee Rd., 1st right onto Old Colony Rd., and 1st right onto Andrews Way. Andrews Way is a short street that looks like a driveway. 1 Andrews Way is the tan-colored house directly ahead on the left. You may want to park on Old Colony Rd. Come in through the garage if you prefer not to climb the stairs to the front door.

From Arlington Center, travel on Mystic St. towards Winchester and take a slight left on Old Mystic St. (about 3/4 mile north of Summer St.), then 2nd left onto Hutchinson Rd., 2nd left onto Morningside Dr., 1st right onto Windmill Lane, 1st left onto Old Colony Rd., and 1st left onto Andrews Way; then follow directions in italics above.

### **LWVA Supports Two Town Meeting Warrant Articles**

The League of Women Voters of Arlington (LWVA) supports **Article 25**, an act authorizing the town of Arlington to offer early in-person voting in Town elections. The article sets minimum requirements for location, dates, and hours. Increased access to the electoral process is integral to ensuring that every American can exercise their right to vote.


The LWVA supports **Article 76**, a resolution declaring that the Alewife Brook in East Arlington is a valuable natural resource area for Arlington residents. The article urges Town officials to engage with the regulatory process to clean up Alewife Brook. The LWV of the United States has encouraged local leagues to take action based on the following statement: The preservation of the physical, chemical, and biological integrity of the earth's ecosystem is essential for the maximum protection of public health and the environment.

# **Contacting Our Elected Officials: Some Tips**

From the League of Women Voters of the US

The strength of our democracy depends on citizens getting involved and engaging our government. Keep these tips handy when contacting your elected officials.

- Politicians are most interested in the words of the people who vote for them. Identify yourself as a constituent of the legislator you're contacting.
- Whether writing or calling your legislators, focus on a single topic. You'll be more effective and receive a faster response.
- Ask the legislator to take specific action, like supporting a piece of legislation. Ask for a written response that gives your legislator's position on the issue.
- Make your points quickly and concisely to have a greater impact.
- When talking about an issue, it's best to use your own words.


