Follow Mass. Ave. to Park Ave. in Arlington Heights. Take Park toward Rt. 2 for 2 blocks to Appleton. Turn right on Appleton for one block to Hillside, then turn left on Hillside. 55 is the 3rd house on the right with a front porch and a large yew bush in the front yard.

If you are coming down Park Avenue from the south, take a left on Florence, then the first right on Hillside. 55 is about 8 houses down on your left.

Arlington and Winchester Leagues to Meet Jointly on Education Policy Consensus

The Arlington League encourages every local member to participate in the upcoming National Consensus Study on the **Role of the Federal Government** in **Public Education**. The scope of the study is broad and includes the following areas under the role of the federal government in public education (pre-K through grade 12): the history, funding and equity issues which are addressed under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, and the common core standards/assessments which are required for many federal grant programs but are national, not federal. The discussion will focus upon how the new standards called Common Core State Standards will be used by the federal government.

The Winchester League, with whom the Arlington League has worked cooperatively before, has invited us to join them in a consensus meeting. The meeting coordinates are as follows:

Forum to Discuss National Budget Impact on Town

The group Arlington 25% Solution is sponsoring a public forum, "Taking on the DC Budget Debate," in Arlington Town Hall, 730 Massachusetts Avenue, on Tuesday, November 8 from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.

Speakers will include Clarissa Rowe, Chair of the Arlington Board of Selectmen; State Representative Jay Kaufman; and Mike Prokosch, National Coordinator of the New Priorities Network. Music will be provided by Chris Nauman, an Arlington singer/songwriter. The moderator will be Annie LaCourt of the Board of Selectmen. Presentations will be followed by an open discussion and action steps.

Arlington 25% Solution says, "Let's talk about what we can do to bring Federal Dollars back into our community for the services and programs that sustain the quality of town-life we treasure here in Arlington. The DC 'Debt Deal' made this past August 1st requires reducing the federal deficit by more than \$2 trillion over ten years. Decisions are being made in Washington now which could heavily impact Arlington – from funding our schools, infrastructure, housing assistance and higher education to social service block grants, youth and senior programs, Medicare, Medicaid, Social Security and more. To save our town services, Arlington just passed an override. We do not want to be faced with new cuts and budget shortfalls. We do not want to balance the federal budget on the backs of our most vulnerable residents or our town's property taxes. We have other choices: Restore fairness to the tax system, cut military spending.... and fund jobs and services."


