The first lunch, on October 8 starting at noon, will feature Maryellen Remmert-Loud, Director of Robbins Library. She will talk about current and planned activities at the Library as well as the opportunities and challenges the Arlington library system faces.

This year the League of Women Voters of Massachusetts has been celebrating 90 years of making a difference and making democracy work. The accomplishments of those 90 years are extraordinary and depend on the support of League members like you.



Representative John Lewis of Georgia welcomed the delegates to the 2010 National Convention of the League of Women Voters in Atlanta in June. His remarks were truly inspiring and even demanding as he acknowledged and recognized the work of the League's founders and members through 90 years of setbacks and successes that were not unlike those of the civil rights movement. He urged us to continue to "get in the way," because getting in the way is how to get things done.

- The Voter Service Committee is facilitating communication among local Leagues across the state
 to leverage the best ideas and to provide support to Leagues who are holding candidates' forums.
 We are collaborating with local Leagues to hold forums for statewide offices including Lt. Governor, State Treasurer and State Auditor.
- The Membership & Training Committee is hosting three training sessions to introduce "Membership Plus" to Leagues around the state to encourage members to learn and share exciting ideas for membership recruitment and more.
- The Program & Action Committee follows LWVMA legislative priorities, lobbies for them and requests action from you when it is appropriate. As a multi-issue organization, we have many irons in the fire and this committee keeps us involved throughout the legislative session.
- The Transportation Restudy Committee is underway to revise and update this important position that affects many LWVMA priority areas, including natural resources and social policy.

The League is a reliable resource for voters and potential voters who call and email seeking nonpartisan, factual information on registration, voting locations, absentee voting and the voting process. The volume of voter information calls increases through Election Day. Members also rely on our staff for information about membership recruitment and organizational matters, voter service and our legislative priorities and action. Whether from a member of the LWV or of the general public, questions are answered in a timely manner.
