## LWVA TOWN DAY BOOTH

Arlington celebrated Town Day on September 15, 2012, and LWV Arlington participated with a booth on Mass. Ave. Carolyn Parsons and Phyllis Maddox organized materials and brought these along with the booth canopy, table, chairs and signs in the early morning to set everything up.

Anne Linn, Ann FitzGerald, Meredith Zona, Elizabeth Thompson, Pat Lieberson, Kim Haase, and Patti Muldoon worked at the booth throughout the day. Kim and Patti were also responsible for packing up the booth at the end of the day.

We registered 24 voters, provided forms for change of address/party/name, identified precinct numbers and polling locations for many interested citizens, and handed out League membership material, literature on the Town's Stormwater Awareness Series, and educational material associated with the Asian Longhorn Beetle, a pest that has killed thousands of trees in Massachusetts.

While the day had a soggy start, it turned out sunny and beautiful, affording the Arlington League the opportunity to connect with a great turnout of Arlington citizens.

# Directions to Elizabeth Thompson's home, 74 Yerxa Road:

Note: Walkway is uneven. Use safety handrails.

From intersection of Summer St. and Brattle St.: Go uphill, immediately bearing left onto Hemlock St. Continue uphill on Hemlock to Yerxa Rd. Turn right onto Yerxa Rd. and go to end of block to 74 Yerxa Rd., which is the last house on the left (a ranch house) and park near that corner. Yerxa Rd. forms a T-shaped intersection with Ridge St. in Arlington.


# From intersection of Mystic St. (Route 3) with Ridge St.:

Turn left onto Ridge St. Continue uphill (stay to right side of the little rotary) all the way to Yerxa Rd. and park. 74 Yerxa Rd. will be on the corner on the right side of the street as you walk onto Yerxa Rd.

The Cuban Missile Crisis 50 Years Later

Thomas Putnam, Director, JFK Library

As the nation and the world mark the 50th anniversary of the Cuban Missile Crisis, JFK Library Director (and Arlington resident) Tom Putnam will recount how the crisis unfolded. Unique archival video and excerpts from secretly recorded tapes will bring these events back to life. Relive the drama of those famous thirteen days, learn how close the world came to a nuclear exchange, and discuss how lessons gleaned from this history might apply to our times.

**Tom Putnam** joined the John F. Kennedy Library and Museum in 1999 as Director of Education and was appointed Director in 2007. He is a graduate of the Woodrow Wilson School at Princeton University and was a Fulbright Scholar in Senegal, West Africa.

Two Conversations will follow in November.

# Woman Suffrage Exhibit at Town Hall

Did you know the men of Arlington cast their votes on the Woman Suffrage amendment to the Constitution back in November, 1915, YES 857, NO 1410. The Amendment was defeated in Massachusetts by 132,000 votes. Mr. C. S. Parker, editor and owner of the *Advocate* approved, having earlier editorialized against passage, warning of the swelling of undesirable voters in the electorate.

The *Advocate* changed its tune when the first vote was held after passage (Nov. 1920): "We have only words of praise for the way Arlington women for the first time exercised this important duty of citizenship." Interestingly the presidential vote totals for 1920 were 5,303 cast for the Republican ticket of Harding and Coolidge, 1,390 for Democrats Cox and Roosevelt.

Town Hall Gallery has an exhibit of Woman Suffrage cartoon posters by artist Blanche Ames (grandmother of Arlington resident Oakes Plimpton) along with a few anti-suffrage cartoons and posters of the Advocate articles and editorials. A September 1915 Advocate in twin articles describes an "Anti-Suffragist Rose Tea" (Ida Robbins in attendance) and "Equal Suffrage Open Air meetings" (Margaret Foley, speaker). The gallery is on the second floor of Town Hall open business hours, tours from 1 to 2 p.m. on Wednesdays, Farmers' Market day, with a reception Friday October 26th at 4 p.m.

- Two informational events for League leaders, in Needham and Amherst
- Increased communication among local Leagues through emails and web sharing site
- Concord-Carlisle LWV forum on the impact of money on politics

- Citizen education programs for Fall 2012 elections
- Providing funds for local Leagues through the Citizen Education Grant Program
- A new, improved lwvma.org website
- Expansion of Membership and Leadership Development Program to three more Leagues
- Two League leader events-fall and spring
- Coming together at the May 2013 LWVMA convention
- Continued opposition to attempts at voter suppression
- More ideas from our members yet to come!
