The League has reserved a booth at Town Day where citizens will have the opportunity to register to vote and where information will be available as to how to run for Town Meeting. Many residents new to Arlington and New England have no idea how the local government operates. Hopefully, petitions will be available for signatures that will advocate for an enhanced Bottle Bill. (As a new League member more than three decades ago, one of my first activities was to go door to door distributing literature in favor of passage of "The Bottle Bill".) The proposed expanded bill will include non-carbonated beverages. The LWVMA has pledged to collect 10,000 of the 100,000 signatures needed by mid-November to ensure it is placed on the November 2014 ballot. Please visit the booth to sign one of the petitions and consider volunteering for a time slot between 9 am – 4 pm. (Refer to the article on page 1.)

Directions to Elizabeth Thompson's home, 74 Yerxa Road:

Note: Walkway is uneven. Use safety handrails.

From intersection of Summer St. and Brattle St.: Go uphill, immediately bearing left onto Hemlock St. Continue uphill on Hemlock to Yerxa Rd. Turn right onto Yerxa Rd. and go to end of block to 74 Yerxa Rd., which is the last house on the left (a ranch house) and park near that corner. Yerxa Rd. forms a T-shaped intersection with Ridge St. in Arlington.

From intersection of Mystic St. (Route 3) with Ridge St.:

Turn left onto Ridge St. Continue uphill (stay to right side of the little rotary) all the way to Yerxa Rd. and park. 74 Yerxa Rd. will be on the corner on the right side of the street as you walk onto Yerxa Rd.



LWVMA Takes Leading Role in Updated Bottle Bill Ballot Question

The League of Women Voters of Massachusetts is asking voters to expand the deposit on single-serve beverage containers to non-carbonated beverages.

The League joined MassPIRG and the Sierra Club on Wednesday, August 7 in filing a request with the Massachusetts Attorney General to put the updated bottle deposit question on the ballot in November 2014 and will be working to collect the signatures needed to get the issue on the ballot.

The current five-cent deposit on carbonated beverages was enacted in 1982. Supporters of the ballot initiative argue that the deposit should be expanded to include such non-carbonated beverages as water, tea and sports drinks. They have been encouraging the legislature to make that change for over 14 years, but the legislation has failed to pass.

"This ballot initiative will give the citizens of Massachusetts the chance to update the bottle deposit law, and past polls have shown widespread support for an expanded deposit program," said Anne Borg, co-president, League of Women Voters of Massachusetts. "Deposits encourage consumers to return bottles so they can be recycled instead of discarding them, reducing litter. Look around any playground and you see discarded water bottles, but few discarded soda cans. Expanding deposits will also reduce the costs to cities and towns to collect and dispose of trash that includes containers that should be recycled."

"It makes no sense to have a deposit on a bottle of sparkling water but not a bottle of still water. Consumers can be easily confused about which bottles to take back for redemption and which to put in their recycling bins," she said.

Supporters of the expanded bottle deposit initiative, including the League, will be collecting signatures this fall to put the question on the ballot. As with the original bottle bill initiative that led to the 1982 law, members of the League of Women Voters of Massachusetts will work to make the updated bottle bill a reality!

Note: The League of Women Voters of Arlington plans to have petitions available at our Town Day booth on September 21.



In Memoriam: Nancy Sweeney

Longtime League member Nancy Sweeney has died after a long battle with oral cancer. Nancy, along with her husband John, also a League member, took part in a number of League activities: reviewing the warrant for Annual Town Meeting, counting ballots for the election of officers at various Housing Authority locations, and helping with various tasks associated with Candidates Night.

Nancy served as a Jason Russell House Tour Guide and as Chair of the Tour Guide Committee for several years. Nancy was a member of the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Birthday Observance Committee, a member of the Human Rights Commission, and a member of the Superintendent's Advisory Committee especially interested in hiring minority educators.

Because of an interest in local public policy, Nancy was a Town Meeting Member (TMM) for many years. Not that I was keeping track, but Nancy did not leave the Town Hall early as many other TMMs do. She took the process of governing Arlington seriously and was always interested in the thoughts of her fellow TMMs.

On a personal note, when an event had a need for a contribution of food, she was always willing to cook something delicious. She cared deeply about the Arlington community and worked to ensure that Arlington was warm and welcoming to all. Nancy will be missed.
