League Mourns Loss of LWVUS President Dr. Deborah Ann Turner

It is with profound sadness that the League of Women Voters announces the passing of our esteemed president, Dr. Deborah Ann Turner, who passed away on Sunday, January 28, 2024, from complications from a pulmonary embolism.

A fearless advocate for voting rights and women's rights, Dr. Turner devoted her life's work to impacting meaningful changes in the lives of voters across the nation. As the 20th president of the 103-year-old voting rights organization, Dr. Turner played a pivotal role in fighting for a more fair and representative union, while uplifting racial equity in the League's mission work.

Dr. Turner first joined the League of Women Voters of Metro Des Moines in 2010 and later served as president until 2015. At the same time, she also served on the LWV of lowa board as the state vice president from 2011 to 2015, becoming co-president in 2015.

"Dr. Turner was the consummate leader who poured her heart and soul for the preservation of our democracy," said Virginia Kase Solomón, CEO of the League of Women Voters. "Her leadership exemplified grace, empathy, strength, and determination, and we will forever be grateful for her passion and dedication to this organization."

Attorney General Campbell Posts Guidance on Candidate Forums and the Open Meeting Law

Before November's municipal elections, the Waltham city solicitor issued an opinion that it would be "'potentially problematic' for elected city officials to participate in discussions at political forums that relate to issues currently before the City Council or its committees," according to an editorial in the Boston *Globe*. That opinion put a damper on a candidate forum held by the Waltham LWV, as well as other forums. Waltham had many candidates, including incumbents, running for City Council.

In a *Globe* letter to the editor, LWVMA asked Attorney General Andrea Campbell to clarify the meaning of the open meeting law as it related to incumbent candidates discussing issues before the board or committee on which they served.

The Attorney General ruled the open meeting law does not prevent incumbent candidates from making comments to the general public:

May members of a public body participate in a candidate forum or otherwise share their views with the public on matters currently or likely to come before their public body?

The Open Meeting Law does not restrict an individual's right to make comments to the general public, particularly as a candidate for office. Rather, it restricts communication between or among a quorum of a public body outside of a meeting; thus, the intent of the public official is an important consideration. Therefore, a communication directed at the broader public is generally permissible even if a quorum of the speaker's own public body incidentally hears or reads the communication, as long as the other public body members do not respond. So, if a member of a public body participates in a candidate forum or a similar public event and other members of that body are attending the forum or event, the member may direct their comments to the public. In addition, even a quorum of members of a public body may participate in a candidate forum or similar public event, and each share their opinions on a matter that may fall within the public body's jurisdiction, as long as the members engage only with the public and not with each other. Therefore, public body members should not direct their comments to their colleagues nor respond to each other's comments.

Note that, if a candidate forum includes two or more incumbents on the same board or committee, these candidates could state their opinions on issues, but they could not debate or respond to each other about those issues.

It's an issue that might come up during town elections, so it's good to have this clarified well in advance.

- H.544/S.268 Ensures age appropriate, medically accurate sex education in schools

State League Urges Support for Comprehensive PFAS Regulation Legislation


The LWVMA is asking the members of the Joint Committee on Public Health to report H2197/S1356, An Act to protect Massachusetts public health from PFAS, favorably – without being watered down by industry inputs.

As we learned during the League Leaders lunch featuring Rep. Kate Hogan, lead sponsor of the House bill, the need to stop production of the more than 20,000 PFAS chemicals and their contamination of our waters, soils and consumer products gets more urgent daily. This comprehensive bill would implement the recommendations of a two-year special task force on this problem. Water contamination dominates the news, but that's the final destination of the chemicals. We need to stop the source. Arlington's legislators Sen. Cindy Friedman, Rep. Sean Garballey, and Rep. Dave Rogers are all co-sponsors of these bills, so please thank them.
